VERSE TYPIST

Imagine yourself using your word processing program to compose a lesson or sermon. You frequently want to include Bible verses in your text. You must stop your writing, look up the verse in your Bible, type in the text, correct your errors and then continue with your lesson. VERSE TYPIST does this for you automatically. As a memory resident program (Desk Accessory), it can be activated at any time, even from inside your word processing program. You simply position the cursor within your lesson document where you want the Bible verse and then activate VERSE TYPIST. Browse through the Bible text and request scriptures to be inserted into your document automatically. It is as simple as that.

VERSE TYPIST is a memory resident program. That means it shares memory with your word processing program. That also means it reduces the memory previously available to your word processing program. If VERSE TYPIST used 100K of memory this could mean your word processing program would only handle small documents containing short lessons. Therefore, VERSE TYPIST has been carefully designed to require only 20K of memory allowing it to share memory without placing limitations on most word processing programs.

BIBLE DICTIONARY

A dictionary defines words and their meanings. A Bible Dictionary defines the special meanings given to words when used in scripture. Common words are not included because their meaning is the same in scripture as when used elsewhere. A Bible Dictionary gives historical background and Biblical usage that helps you understand the language used in scripture. Just select a word from the Bible and the definition of that word as used in the Bible will be displayed.

PERSONAL COMMENTARY

Have you ever written comments in the margin of your Bible? Margin notes in many Bibles represent years of personal study. Buying a new Bible implies the loss of these notes or many hours of copying. Now there is a better choice, with PERSONAL COMMENTARY. This product provides a full featured text editor for entering, editing, saving, retrieving and printing your commentary for any verse in the Bible. Two windows are provided, one for Bible text and one for your commentary. At any time while working with Bible text you may display previously entered commentary or enter new commentary for the new verse being displayed.

CHRONOLOGICAL BIBLE

A presentation of the Bible in chronological order. A chronological chart of the Bible is displayed and you may select any point of time to begin reading. A time sequenced outline of the Bible is then displayed beginning at the point you selected. Each event in the outline is keyed to the scripture text and determines the order of text display. All verses in the Bible that cover the same time period are displayed consecutively.

CHAIN REFERENCE

The most valuable tool for interpreting the Bible is the Bible itself. To better understand a verse, you can study other verses that use the same words or address the same concept. The Chain Reference product provides over 55,000 chains that associate a specific word in a verse with a list of other verses to which you may add or delete references. The screen is divided into three windows containing the starting verse, the chained references and, at your request, any one of the chained verses. If one of the chained verses has its own chain, you may immediately switch to following that chain. You may continue this through many levels and then, with one press of a key, return to the verse that started you on your search.

TOPICS

A topical cross reference of the Bible that works with LIBRARIAN. Over 200 of the most frequently discussed subjects in scripture are included. The cross references deal not only with the word content but also with the concept of the subject. For example, a topic such as WORSHIP would cross reference to verses containing the word, 'worship' plus the concept such as praise, awe, rejoicing, bowing down, etc. These indexes are in the same format as those you create for word searches or for lesson preparation. They can be merged to find verses that deal with combinations of the topics. TOPICS is a starting library of cross reference indexes that you can expand for your personal studies.

PEOPLE

PEOPLE, like TOPICS is a set of indexes created using LIBRARIAN. These indexes cross reference the Bible by more than 140 of the most frequently referenced personalities, allowing you to study the lives of the most significant people in the scriptures. Search out the triumphs, defeats, joys and sorrows of such people as Aaron, Daniel, David, Jacob, Mary, Rachel, Simon and many more.



GREEK transliterator

To better understand the text of an English translation, a student of the Bible can refer back to the original Greek. However, the required language skills have limited such studies to a select few with training in linguistics and years of practice in translation. The GREEK transliterator allows anyone with a knowledge of English to study word usage in Greek. The GREEK transliterator includes: Strong's reference numbers assigned to the English text of the New Testament, and a dictionary of Greek words including the English definition, the Greek transliteration, word origin and derivations.

SEARCHING FOR GREEK WORDS

Begin with an English word and request to find:

- * where the English word occurs in the New Testament
- * which Greek word was in the original text (Strong's reference #)
- * the transliteration (English syllable form) of the Greek word
- * the definition of the Greek word in English

Begin with a Greek word and request to find:

- * where the Greek word occurs in the New Testament
- * the English word(s) to which it was translated
- * word relationships to trace word roots and derivations

ORIGINAL WORD MEANINGS

The study of word usage is an important part of translating between two languages. Accuracy requires careful analysis of the original message and selection of words that convey the equivalent meaning in the new language. This is not a direct process. The English word "spring" could be translated into another language as a pool of water, a metal coil or a season of the year. A translator determines by context which word best fits. The Greek transliterator can show how often each word was used and many different ways the same word was translated. These origin reports assist in understanding how a word was originally used and in what context it assumed different meanings.

EXAMPLES USING THE TRANSLITERATORS

The text is displayed with Strong's reference numbers assigned to the English words as in the example below:

Mat 1:1 The book of the generation of Jesus Christ
0976 1078 2424 5547

You can search for specific Strong's reference numbers. You may then select a word in the verse for study. For example, if you select the word Christ (#5547), the word that occurred in the Greek text will be displayed in the following format:

Strong's Reference Number:	5547
Derivation:	Derived from 5548
Greek Transliteration:	Christos
Definition:	Anointed; the Messiah

A Trace option allows you to trace the word back to it's primary source. You may also find various Greek origins for a common English word or various English translations of a specific Greek word.

This shows the word "pray" occurs 53 times in the set range of verses and is translated from 5 different Greek words.	The Greek word (#4151) occurs 19 times and is translated to English three different ways within the set range.

Word relationships, roots and derivations will be shown.

The GREEK transliterator assists the user to better understand the message intended by the original author without becoming an expert in Greek. It is designed for anyone with a personal computer and does not require special knowledge of Greek language or computers.

HEBREW transliterator

This product works like the GREEK transliterator but for the Old Testament using Hebrew reference numbers and a Hebrew dictionary. The HEBREW transliterator includes Strong's reference numbers assigned to English text of the Old Testament and a dictionary of Hebrew words including the English definition, the Hebrew transliteration, word origin and derivations.
