How to Study the Bible for Yourself! is an interactive book. That means the pages are not presented sequentially. Instead, any subject can be displayed at any time. Key words on every topic are hyper-text links to other topics of more detailed information and examples. Words that may not be familiar are tied to pop-up windows that define those words. Key ideas are linked to other ideas that stimulate your thinking, give instructions, show samples, reference other resources and answer key questions. The reader can jump from any topic to any related topic and easily return. It includes:

- ✿ A method for consistent study that produces consistent interpretation.
- ✿ A reading plan that helps to organize your study into meaningful steps.
- ✿ A sequence of events that ties Biblical history into a single thread of time.
- ✿ A method for studying a topic throughout the Bible text.
- ✿ A background description of key characters and geographic terms in the Bible.
- ✿ A complete outline of every book of the Bible.
- ✿ A bibliography of available resources for better understanding the Bible.

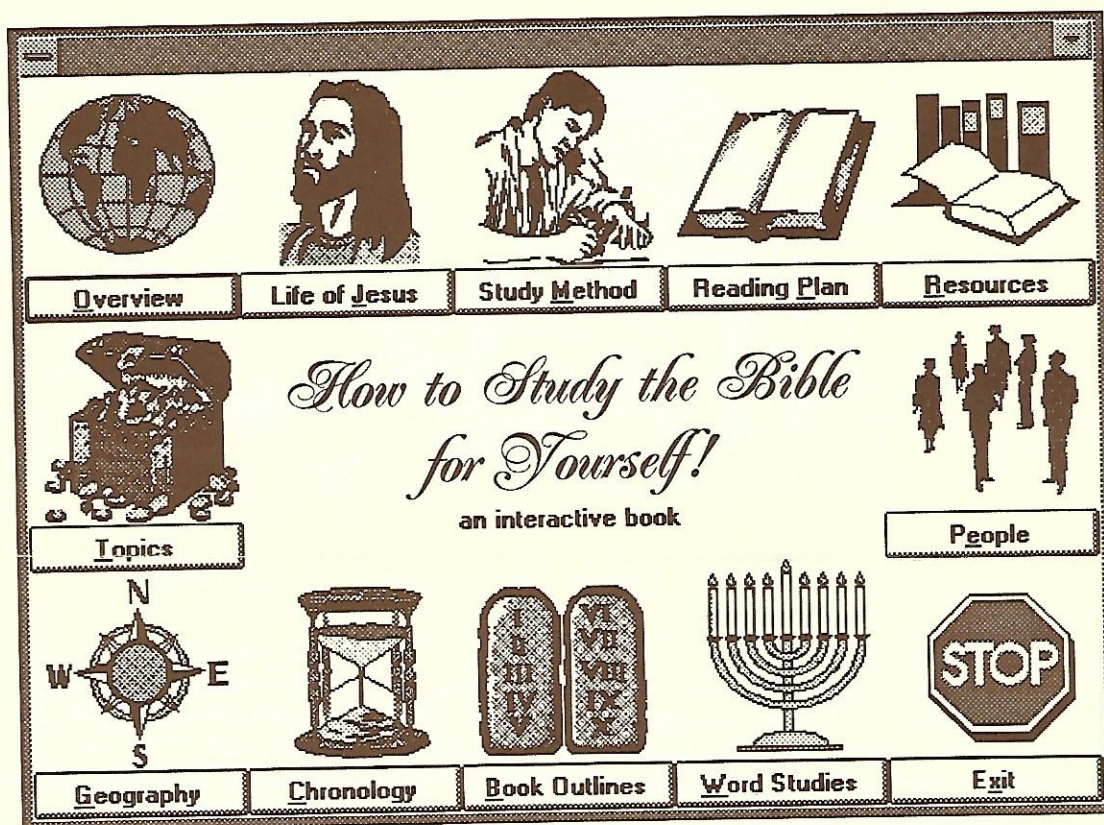

Overview

Describes how this software program works, how to display any topic, how to jump to related topics, how to print, how to add your own comments.

Life of Jesus

This topic puts the Old Testament (with its foretelling of the coming Messiah) into perspective with the New Testament (the fulfillment of the promise). It presents a background for understanding how each part of the Scriptures relates to the whole.

Study Method

A method for studying the Bible is based upon the detailed steps of observing what is said, interpreting what is meant, and applying the principles learned. Emphasis is placed on discovering what the text meant to the original author and the original audience. Examples are provided for each step.

Reading Plan

A recommendation is included for where to begin reading and how to sequence your reading in such a way that the total picture of the Scriptures becomes evident.

Topics

Describes a method for thorough study of a topic wherever it is discussed in the Bible.

People

Describes a method for studying a character. A background description is presented for every major character in the Bible.

Geography

A background description is presented for every major city, river, mountain or region.

Chronology

The flow of Biblical history is divided into ten primary epochs. The major characters, events and locations are described for each time period.

Book Outlines

A complete outline is included for every book. Each outline shows the primary thoughts and the secondary details.

Word Studies

Instructions and examples show how to find the meaning of the original words in the Greek or Hebrew text.
